

From the Pastor

The Nunc Dimittis - the Canticle of Simeon - (Latin for the first line - now Lord let your servant go) is one of three canticles that the Church prays every single day as part of the liturgy of the hours and forms the core of today's Gospel. All three canticles are from the first two chapters of Luke - the Benedictus from Morning prayer is said by Zechariah at the naming of John the Baptist and the Magnificat is our Lady's response to the greeting of Elizabeth. Although I would argue Mary does it best, all three show a deep understanding of providence, that to quote Romans 8:28 "we know that all things work for good for those who love God" - and so Simeon is ready to go in peace, because he has seen Jesus and knows that fulfilling provident love of God.

One of my favorite books about providence is *The Hiding* Place, a memoir by Corrie ten Boom, a deeply Christian Dutch woman whose faith compels her along with her sister, Betsie, and elderly father, Casper, to shelter Jews in their home during the Nazi occupation (thus the titular hiding place). After many near escapes and close calls, they were denounced, arrested (where her father dies of injuries inflicted during the arrest), and eventually sent to the Ravensbrück concentration camp, where her sister is one of the 50,000-90,000 victims of the camp. Corrie is released shortly after the death of Betsie on a clerical error, instead of being gassed with the rest of her prisoner category a week later.

The memoir does not end with her release or even at the end of the war, like so many other WWII memoirs do, but continues to talk about her post-war life. Corrie works for reconciliation, forgiveness, and healing and even turns her former home into a rehabilitation center for former Nazis and collaborators (she also was running a larger site for their victims). At one of her speaking events for the work, she encounters and forgives one of the guards that was particularly brutal to Corrie and Betsie. Through it all Corrie holds to her faith, and she and her sister even ran a bible study in Ravensbrück.

Providence is not that we will be safe from harm or that bad things will never happen to us, but that even those things work for good for those who love God if we can learn, like Simeon or Corrie, Betsie, and Casper, to see all things in the light of the revelation of Christ. On this Feast of the Presentation, we are reminded this light is meant for all peoples and all time, and so we must let this light burn brightly within us.

A blessing of candles has been part of this liturgical observance since before 1000 AD. Those who brought candles for a blessing are reminded that blessed candles need to be used properly, and must be burned or recycled - they cannot be thrown away.

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Question: Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary?

Answer: February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes.

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored. ©LPi
