

From the Pastor

Last week as part of the liturgy of the hours I read a selection from Ad Gentes - Vatican II's decree on missionary activity, which goes very well with this weekend's readings. Like Isaiah; like Peter, James, John, and Andrew; like the Corinthians, we are called and this call is Ad Gentes to the Nations. Every Christian is meant to be a missionary because Christ came on a mission and sent the Holy Spirit upon the Church to continue the mission; the revelation of God's love, the redemption Christ came to bring, to restore us to communion and invite us into God's own divine life. Chapter II of *Ad Gentes* talks about how that missionary work is meant to be done by you in your ordinary lives (Chapter I is about the theology of mission, III is about what clergy and religious are meant to do, and IV, V, and VI are finally about stereotypical missionary work). While I am tempted to read the 7 pages of Chapter II as my homily this weekend, and I had to scrap my summary because my bulletin article was a page and a half long, I will instead go with a lengthy quote:

"The Christian faithful gathered together out of all nations into the Church 'are not marked off from the rest of men by their government, nor by their language, nor by their political institutions,' and so they should live for God and Christ in a respectable way of their own national life. As good citizens, they should be true and effective patriots, all together avoiding racial prejudice and hypernationalism, and should foster a universal love for man. To obtain all these things, the most important and therefore worthy of special attention are the Christian laity: namely, those who have been incorporated into Christ and live in the world. For it is up to them, imbued with the spirit of Christ, to be a leaven working on the temporal order from within, to dispose it always in accordance with Christ. But it is not enough that the Christian people be present and be organized in a given nation, nor is it enough to carry out an apostolate by way of example. They are organized for this purpose, they are present for this, to announce Christ to their non-Christian fellowcitizens by word and example, and to aid them toward the full reception of Christ."- Ad Gentes 15

This coming week I will be on vacation with some brother priests, so there will be no daily masses, nor confession or adoration on Friday. Fr. Patrick Hipwell, who was my first boss as a newly ordained priest, will be covering the weekend masses, and I will be back Monday. He was once pastor in Hamel, and is a major card shark, so feel free to ask him how his Bridge or Euchre games are going. I will keep the parish in my prayers as always, and ask you to pray for me in my travels.

PRIEST SHORTAGE

Question: Would optional celibacy help the priest shortage?

Answer: This is a hotly debated topic. There are good arguments on both sides, and there is no clear answer that emerges. However, the shortage of clergy in denominations that do allow marriage would seem to indicate that optional celibacy is not the quick answer that some might think. No one solution is perfect. Each one has its flaws and problems that are not easily solved. While optional celibacy would open ordination to some great men who are married, it also brings the problems of family, financial support, marital problems, and issues – good and bad – of childrearing. So it would not seem that optional celibacy is a realistic solution to the shortage of clergy.

With all of the varied challenges and problems facing the Church, it is easy to forget that the Holy Spirit leads us. Openness, dialogue, and education are second to our prayers and petitions to the Holy Spirit to make clear the path the Church should follow. A response that is rooted in a culture of political correctness is almost certainly doomed; a response that is rooted in prayer and in God cannot fail. ©LPi
