

From the Pastor

Two Julie Andrews vehicles are truly foundational to my childhood. From the Sound of Music, I learned the musical scale, that even Nazis shouldn't mess with Benedictine nuns, and a slight discomfort with puppets. From Mary Poppins, I learned all sorts of terms from suffragettes to supercalifragilistic expialidocious, to what I would argue is the theme of the movie: noblesse oblige. Noblesse oblige is French for nobility obliges and is the concept that those who have ought to care for those below them.

The Banks family in Mary Poppins is by no means nobility; in the British system they would fall decidedly within the mid to lower third of the second class of ranks and are in American considerations middle class (even with the household staff since the Banks children facing genteel poverty in the poorer sequel), but they still called to care for those less fortunate - to "feed the birds". The act of spending tuppence (literally two pennies) feeding some pigeons on the steps of St. Paul's is a direct act of charity to the woman selling the bird seed. It's not much but it's also everything, because as we hear at the conclusion of this weekend's gospel the measure with which we measure will be measure out to us. We ought to be profoundly aware of God's mercy for us, of His great and prodigal love of us, and our continuing need of His loving mercy; and we therefore should be asking ourselves whether we measure in the same way.

ASH WEDNESDAY

Question: Is Ash Wednesday a holy day of obligation?

Answer: Despite the often packed churches, you may be surprised to hear that the answer is no! Holy days of obligation commemorate a particular event (such as the birth of Christ at Christmas) or celebrate particular people (such as Mary's Immaculate Conception or the feast of All Saints). Ash Wednesday is a day of penance, fasting, and abstinence to begin the season of Lent. In a sense, it focuses on a *concept* rather than something particular and concrete.

Of course, repentance ought to be reflected in particular, concrete ways! That's one of the reasons that attending Mass on Ash Wednesday is a very good idea. It marks the beginning of a solemn season of penance. Despite all its comparisons to the desert, Lent can be very fruitful for our spiritual growth! Beginning this season with the celebration of Mass and the reception of ashes is a sign of our commitment to God and to spiritual growth.

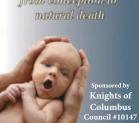
