

Notes from the Pastor

This week I celebrated my first anniversary of starting at St. John's and our country celebrated its 248th anniversary of declaring independence. While that is certainly a cause for personal and national rejoicing, I feel compelled by this weekend's readings to be a little prophetic, now that I've had a brief time to get to know you, and I want to point out words from St. John Chrysostom, "I want you to have confidence in yourselves". In their original context, Chrysostom is trying to motivate his people to do the works of mercy, that by doing so they know that God is working in their lives, and I think that is an important thing for us to remember as a parish as well, that the same Lord is working in our lives as well, and so we don't need to fear the future.

I think there is a lot of fear and anxiety in our society today - about the election, about the economy, about America's ongoing status as world leader or our culture or this or that; and even more so as American Catholicsare we still relevant, how can we get the younger generations involved, will our particular parish be around? I don't think those are unhealthy questions to ask or worry about, but what is important is what we do with the worry - that we don't ruminate or sit on them, but use this worry to do our part, because realistically our parish still should be around to see the 350th anniversary of our nation's independence provided we continue to practice good stewardship and continue to try to engage people (shameless Rome pilgrimage plug; there are a number of churches in Rome that are built on house churches dating to the apostolic age and so have been functioning as parishes for over 1900 years, so we have a long way to go).

Although I don't know what tomorrow will bring or predict the future state of our democracy, I can do my best to live out my faith in the here and the now, to have confidence that the Lord who called me to this place and time will continue to provide, and to take confidence in myself because I place my confidence in the Lord.

MUSIC DIRECTOR JOB OPENING


